From the Village President

What a great winter we had this year! I hope you were able to get out and enjoy it. This is the Village of Cross Plains 100 year anniversary of being a Village. We will be celebrating this important milestone throughout the year. This is also going to be a busy Spring for the Village. First of all, we need you to respond to the 2020 Census. The data informs where over \$675 billion in Federal funding is spent each year in States and Communities like ours. The 2020 Census is still looking for part-time staff, paying \$22.00 per hour and \$.58 per mile. The Village is also working on securing millions of dollars for two major flood mitigation projects and we have a big election coming up next month. Please vote!

The Village needs your help. We are looking for 7 Village residents to be on the Zoning Board of Appeals. This Board is established to provide an appeal procedure for persons who deem themselves aggrieved by decisions of administrative officers in the enforcement of the zoning regulations. The terms will be 1-3 years, staggered. Meetings will be once a month, unless there is nothing to come before the board, which is common.

The Board of Appeals shall have the following powers (chapter = zoning regulation):

- (1) To hear and decide appeals where it is alleged that there is an error in any order, requirement, decision or determination made by an administrative official in the enforcement, administration or interpretation of this Chapter.
- (2) To hear and decide special exceptions to the terms of this Chapter upon which the Board is required to pass.
- (3) To authorize upon appeal in specific cases, such variances from the terms of this Chapter as will not be contrary to the public interest, when, owing to special conditions, a literal enforcement will result in practical difficulty or unnecessary hardship, so that the spirit of this Chapter shall be observed, public safety and welfare secured, and substantial justice done. The Board may not permit as a variance, any use that is not permitted under this Chapter for property in the zoning district where the affected person's land is located.
- (4) Attach conditions of approval to any action described under this section, in furtherance of the general purpose and intent of this Chapter.
- (5) Interpret the provisions of this Chapter in such a way as to carry out the intent and purpose of this Chapter as shown on the Official Zoning Map where the actual street layout on the ground varies from the street layout on the aforesaid map.
- (6) The Zoning Board of Appeals shall have the power to call on any other Village department for assistance in the performance of its duties and it shall be the duty of such other departments to render such assistance as may be reasonably required.

In exercising the above listed duties and responsibilities, the Board may reverse or affirm, wholly or in part, or may modify any order, requirement, decision or determination of the Zoning Administrator or other administrative officer from whom the appeal is taken. The concurring vote of 4 members of the Board shall be necessary to reverse any order, requirements, decision or determination for which an appeal has been requested.

The Board is a quasi-judicial body. Any appeals from the Board will go to Circuit Court.

From the Chief

I would like to thank the community members, staff and elected officials, who have reached out to me and made me feel welcome as I transition into this new role. I am humbled by your acts of inclusion and kindness. It is an honor and a privilege to be your Chief of Police, and I am proud of my fellow Police Officers and the civilians that make up the Cross Plains Police Department.

The Cross Plains Police Department has always prided itself on maintaining a strong relationship with the community and through initiatives like the Village of Cross Plains Newsletter, we plan to work hard to stay connected with the community. In this newsletter we will be discussing issues surrounding animal control, fire prevention and recreational vehicle parking.

As we get ready to enjoy Spring, we would like to remind everyone that Village Ordinance prohibits animals from running at large, except on private property. The owner of every animal is responsible for the conduct of the animal. If an animal leaves feces, refuse, dirt, food or other foreign substances upon any public sidewalk, terrace, street or other public lands or upon private property other than that of the animal's owner, then the animal's owner or caretaker must immediately remove those substances and dispose of them in the proper manner.

We would also like to remind everyone that Village Ordinance strictly prohibits burning rubbish, leaves, construction waste and other similar material as a means of disposal. Outdoor fireplaces, pits and bowls designed for holding or burning of wood are allowed but are subject to multiple restrictions. Pits must have an enclosure, heavy screen or spark arrestor to control and contain embers and sparks. Fireplaces or pits must not be used within fifteen feet of a building or lot line. Only clean, dry wood is permitted to be burned in fireplaces or pits. No trash, yard waste or construction material are allowed to be burned. If the fireplace is a propane unit, only propane can be burned. The smoke from the fireplace or pit cannot create a nuisance. A fire extinguisher, garden hose or other method of fire control must be readily available. The fireplace or pit must be supervised by a responsible adult. The fire must be completely extinguished before the fireplace or pit is left unsupervised.

Lastly, we would like to remind everyone, Village Ordinance prohibits in all residential and commercial districts, the parking or storage of recreational vehicles on public streets or public property in excess of 48 hours. It is permissible to park or store a recreational vehicle on private property if the recreational vehicle is at least fifteen feet from the face of any curb, parked in a driveway and no part of the recreational vehicle is extended over the public sidewalk or public right-of-way.

On behalf of the men and women of the Cross Plains Police Department, I encourage the community to call us with any questions and concerns and involve us in any of your needs. We are here to serve.




Backpacking at the Library



2020 Kohl Educational Foundation Teacher Fellowship Winners Named

Glacier Creek sixth-grade teacher Lyndsey Ebben and MHS band teacher Doug Brown, have been named 2020 Kohl Educational Foundation Teacher Fellowship winners.

Since 2015, six MCPASD staff members -- Glacier Creek special education teacher Tim Ashe (2015), MHS and Kromrey German teacher Jolene Wochenske (2015), Kromrey principal Steve Soeteber (2016), MHS orchestra teacher Steve Kurr (2017), Glacier Creek band teacher Jeanne Hammes (2017) and Glacier Creek sixth-grade teacher Rhonda Veroeven (2018) -- have received Kohl Educational Foundation awards. In addition, Elm Lawn and Sunset Ridge art teacher Monica Kmak was honored in 2018 when she worked in Dodgeville.

Brown and Ebben were two of 100 teachers selected from around the state. There were nine teachers from the CESA 2 region who were recognized. They will be recognized along with recipients from CESAs 3 and 5 at a ceremony in Baraboo on May 16th.



Principal Named at Middleton High School

Peg Shoemaker has been named the principal at Middleton High School, Superintendent Dana Monogue announced in late January.

Shoemaker was named the interim principal in June 2019, replacing Steve Plank, who served as principal at MHS for five years before leaving to become superintendent of the Burlington Area School District.

Shoemaker previously served six years as the principal at Hudson High School. Before that, she served as the principal at Willow River Elementary in Hudson. She also served as a teacher and Associate Director of Learning Services. In all she worked for 28 years in Hudson.



Requests for Approving Alternate School Assignments

Deputy Superintendent Sherri Cyra, previewed the guidelines for grandfathering students and approving alternate school assignments for the upcoming school year at the Board of Education regular meeting on January 13th.

Cyra noted there have been more inquiries than typical from District families as a result of the internal boundary changes the Board approved in December.

The District's plan allows students going into fourth or eighth grade in 2020-21 to remain at their current school as long as the family provides transportation. Families had to let the District know by the end of January if they wanted their child to remain at their current school in 2020-21.

Cyra said alternate school assignments were only approved if a school had space, it doesn't result in the need for additional staffing and there extenuating circumstances for families.

More from the MCPASD

The MHS boys swimming and diving team and girls snowboard team each won state titles recently.

The swimming and diving team won the first state title in program history on February 22nd, after finishing second in the past two seasons. MHS finished with 228 points, six more than runner-up and top-ranked Waukesha South-Catholic Memorial. That was 44 points more than the Cardinals were projected to score.

The girls snowboard team captured its fourth consecutive WIARA state championship on February 15th at Mount La Crosse. The Cardinals finished with 104 points. Waunakee was second with 137 points. Six teams competed at the state meet, which consisted of the slalom, giant slalom and boardercross. MHS had three girls place in the top 10. Sophomore Ella E'Orazio finished third overall. Her best finish was second in the slalom.

Then **call the Village Office at 798-3241 to get your name on the pick up list**. There is no extra charge for this service! This pick up is for Village residents only and is only for metal - no appliances, wood furniture or other white goods will be accepted for this special pick up.

The second event, is when Resource Solutions will be in town from **8am-12pm**. Residents and non-residents may bring their computers, electronics and appliances to the Village Hall to be recycled. Spring Election and Presidential Preference Primary Tuesday, April 7th, 2020

Elections are held at the Cross Plains-Berry Fire Station
1501 Bourbon Rd from 7:00AM - 8:00PM

This election will include a local race to elect **three Village Trustee positions**. Each Trustee is elected to serve a two-year term. **Kevin Thusius (i), Cameron Bjorkland, Bill Brosius and Michael Pomykalski** will be on the ballot.
