I think it is great that the hardware store is returning to its original location. The original Cross Plains hardware store was located in the Kalscheur Implement area. We can expect to see construction starting soon.

I would also like to take this time to thank all the residents who give their time to serve on the various Village committees and commissions. It is a time commitment to serve and I very much appreciate the work that they do.

Middleton - Cross Plains Area School District

Co-chair Luke Francois updated the Board of Education at its regular meeting on Feb. 27 on the work of the Facilities Planning Committee, including their latest brainstorming session at their meeting earlier this month at West Middleton.

Francois said the FPC continues to think big and bold, but suggested it may need the school board to decide if it needs to narrow its scope and focus on a couple of buildings.

Meanwhile, the District hired Epstein Uhen Architects as the firm to help with the facility planning process. Requests for proposals for construction services are being accepted in March.

Park principal Monica Schommer updated the Board of Education at its regular meeting on Feb. 27 on the school's growth and goals along with exciting things happening there.

Schommer was appreciative of the Board's visit to the school earlier in the year along with the listening session with staff before Monday's meeting. She said both have a huge impact on morale. She also is proud of the school's wellness efforts. "It's really had a huge impact," she said. "It's a great place to be."

Superintendent George Mavroulis reviewed the strategy map, which lays out the District's goals, initiatives and priorities that administration has been working on the past few months at the Board of Education regular meeting on Feb. 13. "We aren't finished," he said "This isn't a stagnant document."

The Board of Education unanimously approved the open enrollment plan for 2017-18 at its regular meeting on Jan. 23. The Board considered five separate questions related to open enrollment. The Board voted to drop the re-application requirement for open enrollment students when they go from the elementary to middle school that was implemented last year. Superintendent George Mavroulis said that will impact 10 students: 4 at Kromrey, 3 at Glacier Creek and 3 online.

Parks Update: Spring Planting!

As you may have noticed there are number of new trees and shrubs being planted in our village parks! Most of the new additions are fruit-bearing shrubs and in time, will produce edible fruits for both humans and birds, as well as aesthetics similar to ornamental shrubs. The trees, white oaks, and shagbark hickories are native to this region and will provide nuts and much needed shade. Being native means they are hardy and used to the harsh winters, the insects, and diseases that are found here. A couple species are varieties of native shrubs that produce better fruit crops.

You may have also noticed they are small in stature. These plants were obtained from a “bulk plant” program where we can purchase a greater amount of plants at a much cheaper price. Many of our parks already have larger trees established including the threatened Ash tree. As these older trees succumb to the emerald ash borer or begin slowly die back, we’re giving new trees a head start on filling the gaps succumbed to the borer. The shrubs will provide a new layer of color and texture to the parks that was previously non-existent. If you have any questions or would like more information on the plantings, please contact the Parks and Recreation Department.

Plant list:

Aronia berry: Native. Good color in fall. Fruit in late summer. Called a “super-food”.

Red Currant: Red clustered fruiting in July.

Elderberry: Native. Large clusters of white flowers, and dark purple berries. Best when cooked

Hazelnut: Nuts ripening around August.

Shagbark Hickory: Native.

White Oak: Native.

PawPaw: Native/introduced. Large green fruits with flavor like banana/mango. August-September.

Eastern Redbud: Native. Red/pink showy flowers in April.

Serviceberry: Native. Flowers in April, fruits in June. Red/purple blueberry-like fruits.

Mountain Biking – Cedar Hill Conservancy

Over the course of a year, local mountain biking enthusiasts CORP (Capital Off Road Pathfinders) have been working diligently to assemble a formal trail proposal for a mixed-use single track trail on Cedar Hill Conservancy. In March, organizer Mike Cliff presented and was given approval of the formal trail proposal, working with the Parks and Recreation Department to establish the final trail alignment, policies, and agreement. Once finalized, CORP will begin coordinating fundraising, final design plans, and construction of the mixed-use trail. Zander Community Nature Park – Trail Expansion Update

The “North Phase” of the trail expansion project is budgeted for 2017. The Village will begin Bid Advertisements June 1 and June 8 with construction beginning in September. (Providing no setbacks)

In March, the Village was awarded an additional \$205,000 from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Stewardship Grant Program, totaling \$289,518 from the WDNR for this project. The “South Phase” of the trail expansion project is still on course for construction in 2018. The Village has received a total of **\$539,518** to date for the project in grants/outside funding.






