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CHAPTER 43

DANCE HALLS AND AMUSEMENT PLACES

SECTION 43.01 License Required.

No person shall conduct any dance to which the public is admitted for a fee or conduct, establish or manage any public dance hall or pavilion, amusement park or arcade, carnival, street fair, bathing beach or other like place of amusement without first securing a license as provided herein. No person required to have such a license shall conduct a dance to which the public is admitted except in the presence and under the supervision of the Village Police Department.

SECTION 43.02 License Application and Fee.

Application shall be obtained from and filed with the Village Administrator/Clerk-Treasurer. The annual license fee for a dance hall, pavilion or amusement park or arcade shall be as set by the Village Board. The fee shall be paid to the Village Administrator/Clerk-Treasurer and a receipt therefore shall accompany the application. The application shall contain such information as the Administrator/Clerk-Treasurer may require for the effective enforcement of this chapter and the safeguarding of Village residents and guests and shall be for a one-year period expiring June 30 of each year.

SECTION 43.03 Dance Permit.

A permit shall be obtained by each licensed dance hall or pavilion for each dance. The permit fee shall be as set by the Village Board and shall be paid to the Village Administrator/Clerk-Treasurer.

SECTION 43.04 Inspections.

The Village Police Department shall inspect all licensed premises and supervise public dances and places of amusement.

SECTION 43.05 Enforcement; Violations and Penalties.

- (a) **Violations.** The following penalties shall apply to violations of this chapter: not to exceed \$25.
- (b) **Each Day a Separate Offense.** Each day of a continuing violation shall constitute a separate offense.
- (c) **Revocation or Suspension.** In addition to any other penalties imposed, any license issued under the provisions of this chapter may be revoked or suspended

by the Village Board for any period the Board designates pursuant to the following:

- (1) **Grounds.** Licenses may be revoked or suspended for any of the following:
 - a. Violations of this chapter.
 - b. Violations of state law.
 - c. Fraud or misrepresentation in the conduct of the licensed activity.
 - d. Furnishing incorrect information in the application.
- (2) **Procedures.** The Village Board shall conduct a hearing, giving the licensee an opportunity to be heard, prior to suspending or revoking any license.
- (3) **Review of Suspension or Revocation.** Review of the decision to revoke or suspend a license shall be permitted as provided for in Ch 68, Wis. Stats.
